

## INTERNET SAFETY TIPS FOR PARENTS



You should include the kinds/t pes of sites that are off limit.

Keep Internet-connected computers in an open area and out of our teens bedrooms

Talk to them about their online friends and activities just as ou ould about their other activities.

Kno hich chat rooms or message boards our teens visit, and hom the talk to.

Encourage them to use monitored chat rooms.

Talk to our teens about their Instant Messaging list and make sure the re not talking to strangers.

Insist that the tell ou first if the ant to meet an "online friend." It is potentiall dangerous for this meeting to take place unsupervised.

Teach our teens never to give out personal information ithout our permission hen using e-mail, chat rooms or instant messaging, filling out registration forms and personal profiles, and entering online contests.

Encourage our teens to come to ou if the find messages that make them feel uncomfortable or threatened. (Sta calm. If ou "freak out" the on t turn to ou for help hen the need it.)

Talk to our teenagers about online pornograph and direct them to good sites about health and se ualit .

Insist the sta in public chat room areas.

Help protect them from spam. Tell our teens not to give out their email address online, not to respond to junk mail, and to use e-mail filters.

Be a are of the Web sites that our teens frequent, and make sure the sites don't contain personal photos and information or offensive content.

Teach our kids responsible online behaviour. File-sharing and taking te t, images or art ork ma infringe on cop right la s.

Talk to them about ethical behaviour. The should not be using the Internet to spread gossip, bull or threaten others.

Make sure our teens check ith ou before making financial transactions online.

Discuss gambling and its potential risks and remind our teens that it is illegal for them to gamble online.

Ensure our computer is properl protected b using/installing up-to-date securit patches, current antivirus soft are and a fire all to protect it from intrusions (hackers).



Al a s delete unkno n email attachments ithout opening them. The can contain destructive viruses.

Al a s virus scan all files that are do nloaded to our computer for viruses, even those from kno n persons.
